Vocabulary

- **Nomad** - a person that travels from place to place and has no permanent home
- **Flint** - a hard grey rock used to make tools
- **Neolithic** - the later part of the Stone Age
- **Mesolithic** - the middle part of the Stone Age
- **Paleolithic** - the earliest part of the Stone Age when basic tools were used
- **Archaeologist** - a person who studies history through the excavation of sites and artefacts
- **Artefact** - a human made object of historical interest
