MESSAGE FROM MRS KINGHAM

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now into the fourth week of term and the end of the first month of the year. I cannot believe that it has gone so quickly. It really has been an intense, but enjoyable, first few weeks for me learning about our children and school.

My initial plan was to sit back and learn about the school and the culture that already exists with St Michael's, however, I have been concerned with some of the learning behaviour that I have seen across the school. Learning is a right for all children and I am passionate about providing a safe, secure and caring environment in which our children and staff can thrive. As such is the case, in my second week I commissioned a full safeguarding and behaviour audit with the local authority. This highlighted the need for whole school intervention to ensure that all of the support systems enhance and enrich the learning behaviour of many groups of children across our school.

Over the coming weeks we will be focussing on the following:

- Whole school routines and expectations of all children and our team
- Review and revision of the Behaviour Policy (this will be a collaborative project that includes staff, children and parents)
- Review of impact of all current behaviour plans
- Review of all current EHCPs and the need and provision across the school
- Primary Behaviour Service whole school project for the next half term and coaching for our staff team
- Learning environment audit and action plan to support all learners
- Collaborative meetings with parents with a focus on positive learning behaviour
- Review effectiveness of our current communication methods

My first priority was to ensure that the school is a safe and welcoming place for all of us to be. This has meant the changing of routines around school. This week the children have adapted really well to walking on the left around school calmly, respecting the rules of each space that they are in (including new routines to come in from breaks).

I am asking for your support and collaboration in reinforcing these expectations at home. By working together, we can help every child understand the importance of positive behaviour and the impact it has on themselves and those around them. Please speak to your child about the importance of showing respect and following instructions, and encourage them to make choices that contribute to a friendly and productive school environment.

The key to changing a culture around learning behaviour is to remain consistent with high expectations of all children and a very clear vision of what excellent learning behaviour looks like. Over the coming weeks we will share this with both yourselves and our children so that we can work together to make St Michael's the very best that it can be.



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School Priorities

After my initial weeks in school, I have been able to prioritise the following as our school priorities for the year ahead:

- Embed and sustain a strong safeguarding culture across our school
- Improve behaviour for learning across the school
- Develop and adapt the SEN provision across the school to meet the needs of all learners
- Develop a whole school pedagogy (the way we teach) to match the needs of our children and community
- Establish a consistent staff team to ensure that children have consistent routines and
- Work with Hampshire as a supported school to review our current curriculum offer

Uniform and presentation standards

Part of successful learning is to follow the rules of the school. Uniform requirements are there to ensure that all children feel a sense of belonging. Please ensure that children are dressed in full school uniform each day. If you require any additional items, please do speak with the school office and they can help you and point you in the right direction.

Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied up and no jewellery (apart from ear studs) to be worn. Make up and face paint is also not permitted at school unless it is an agreed dress up or theme day.

We are currently waiting for further advise from the UKHSA (UK Health and Safety Agency). Can we please remind you to look for symptoms, and take your child to the GP if you have any concerns. 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Internet Safety – social media and gaming

As I am sure you are aware, internet safety is high on the agenda for all schools. It has come to my attention that some children are engaging in social media apps (such as WhatsApp) and are not making the most positive choices in things that are being posted in their group chats. Please remember to check your children's phones at regular intervals to safeguard them from any online issues and potential exposure to images and language that they should not be seeing at their age. Children are also enjoying gaming – which is a real positive for them when this is controlled in the home environment, however, sometimes children mention games that have a higher age rating than appropriate for primary school children. Mobile phones on site

Year 5 and 6 are allowed to bring mobile phones to school but they must be handed in as soon as they arrive at their classroom door. Please can I remind parents and children that children's mobile phones should not be used on the school site, even in the playground. This is down to safeguarding for all children; it is our role to ensure that children are not photographed and are not exposed to non-filtered and monitored devices within the school site. We will confirm this with the children next week in Monday assembly and this will go into full effect from Tuesday.

Thank you for your continued support as we navigate the changes that are required for our school improvement journey – I am proud to be part of this community and will endeavour to work alongside you to make this the very best school that it can be.
