## **MESSAGE FROM MRS JONES**

What a positive start to the year we have had, with many successful parent events in school, workshops, family quiz night and sporting events all taking place. 

#### Year 3 Parent Event: Sewing

#### Year 3 Butser Ancient Farm Trip: Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March 2024 All day

Year 3 will be visiting Butser Ancient Farm as part of this term's work on The Roman Empire. The children will be taking part in various activities including archaeological excavation, Roman maths, Flint wall building and Villa tour.

The trip will take place on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March, leaving school at 9.00am, travelling by coach and returning to school by 3.20pm. The children will need to be in school for registration by 8.40am to enable a prompt departure. The children are required to wear their school uniform and a waterproof coat, and will need a packed lunch and water bottle (in a small named bag that the child can carry). The school can provide a packed lunch at a cost of £3.00.

In order for this trip to go ahead a voluntary contribution of £22.00 is requested to contribute towards the cost of travel and the activities provided by Butser Ancient Farm. Payment is required no later than Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2024.

#### YEAR 4

#### Year 4 Viking Day: Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Year 4 will be having a Viking Day at school on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March. Children are encouraged to dress up as Vikings for the day. Different activities will be planned throughout the day. The day will run from 9.00-4.30pm and your child's teacher will be at the front gate to meet your child, where your child will be registered. The children are required to wear their school PE kit, trainers and have warm wet weather gear with them. They will need a packed lunch, snacks and water bottle (in a named bag that the child can carry). The school can provide a packed lunch at a cost of  $\pm 3.00$ .

Please can we remind you that no transport is being provided by the school for children to attend the Runways End Activity Day. Therefore, it is the parent's responsibility to drop off children at Runways End for 9.00am and pick up from Runways End at 4.30pm. A register will be taken at 9.00am at Runways End in the morning of the activity day. If your child is not present, normal absence procedures apply.

There is a section on the reply slip to confirm the name of the person who is collecting your child from Runways End at 4.30pm.

In order for this trip to go ahead, a voluntary contribution of £39.00 is requested to contribute towards the activities provided by Runways End. Payment is required no later than Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024.

There is also a walk-in clinic for under-12s, available Monday - Saturdays from 2.00-6.00pm. Booking is strongly recommended for children under 12 to avoid long waiting times and to ensure availability of appointment as those with urgent clinical needs will be prioritised.

#### HAMPSHIRE SCHOOL LIBRARY SERVICE: E-LIBRARY

All children are invited to use an E-Library service, run by The Hampshire School Library Service. Children are given access to premium e-books, audiobooks, comics, and magazines. There are some brilliant stories and non-fiction texts available.

The school's Sora digital collection, can be accessed via the is Sora app or on any device/browser and desktop. Please follow the instructions below to access the school's digital collection:

- 1. Download the Sora app or explore in browser https://soraapp.com. The Sora app is available through the Google Play and Apple App stores.
  - Sora can also be accessed on any device/browser at https://soraapp.com/library/hampshiresls
- 2. In Sora, find our school or enter the setup code hampshiresls
- 3. Sign-in to St Michael's collection of e-books by inputting the username. There is no password required. The username is your child's first name and surname separated by a full stop: firstname.surname
- 4. Browse the Explore tab and borrow a book. Your book will open so you can start reading right away.

We really hope that you will enjoy using the E-library service, and look forward to hearing about the books that children are reading!
