PARENTS CONSULTATION EVENINGS

WORLD BOOK DAY - Thursday 5th March

On Thursday 5th March it is World Book Day. This year we are giving the children different options for dressing up. Children can either:

- dress up as a book character
- wear their own clothes/school uniform and bring in some clues about their favourite book character so that other children can guess who it is, from the clues
- dress up in pyjamas/comfy clothes that are good for snuggling up and reading in

The theme for World Book Day this year is 'Reading For Fun' with the aim of getting all children loving books and reading. Research shows that half a million children in England do not own a single book; we will be giving out World Book Day tokens so that children can either get one of the 12 free books with their token or put it towards buying a more expensive book.

COMIC RELIEF - Friday 20th March

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PAYMENTS FOR TRIPS ETC

Whilst payment for school trips and workshops is voluntary, we cannot continue to run these without your financial support. We would therefore like to remind parents and carers to check their ScoPay accounts to make sure there are no outstanding balances. Any contribution is appreciated if you feel unable to pay the full amount.

UNIFORM

Just a reminder that children can wear plain, non logo black leggings, skorts, shorts (the usual PE short design) or plain, non logo black tracksuit trousers. We do not allow cycling shorts for various reasons, one of these being that they are often worn very short and do not show below the t shirt.

COATS

As we are still in the depths of winter and the weather is still rather cold, please can you ensure that your child is bringing a coat to school, as they will be out on the playground at break and lunch times.

WEARING OF JEWELLERY IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION LESSONS

Please can all parents/carers be aware that Hampshire County Council's guidance on wearing jewellery in PE lessons has now changed based on national advice issued by the British Association of Advisers and Lecturers in Physical Education (BAALPE) and The Association of Physical Education (AfPE).

It is now felt that the taping of earrings 'creates a perception of safety and is not recommended', as there have been several incidences within the local authority where children's ears have been injured from earrings being pulled out from under the tape.

The new guidelines state: **All jewellery should be removed prior to a physical education lesson due to the increased risk of it becoming caught or causing injury to the wearer or fellow learner. The wearing of any jewellery increases the risk of injury significantly.**

PLEASE NOTE that our school policy has been amended to reflect this. From March 2025, the main points to note from the policy are:

- The only jewellery the school permits a child to wear is a plain small wrist watch and/or plain small studs for earrings. Other items are not permissible in school.
- Pupils with earrings must remove them for PE. Taping of earrings is not an option.

WATER BOTTLES

Please can we remind you to send your child in to school with a named water bottle.

Water is crucial to being healthy and ready to learn and children have access to their bottles at regular intervals throughout the day. As the weather turns warmer it is important that they can keep hydrated throughout the school day. Please do not put anything other than water in your child's bottle.



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NO SWEETS IN SCHOOL

Please can we advise that sweets are not allowed to be given out in school, at the end of the day for birthdays or celebrations, or in packed lunches due to allergies and the encouragement of a healthier life style.

FUNDRAISING - THE LITTLE RECYCLERS

Just a reminder that we have signed up to a clothing recycling scheme, called The Little Recyclers. We are pleased to say that we can now accept clothing donations at any time - please bring any bags of unwanted clothes to the school office.

PARKING AT SCHOOL DROP OFF & COLLECTION

We have been contacted by some of the school's neighbours asking parents not to park across driveways or in designated parking bays in private properties.

As with many other schools, we do not have a parent car park. If you do need to drive to drop off or collect your child by car, please park considerately and ensure you are not obstructing our neighbours drives, garages or access to roads.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

If you think your child may need Calpol or other medication during the school day, this must be provided by parents and handed to the School Office, together with a completed 'Request for Administration of Medication in School' form and details of any medicine already administered that day. All medication must be in its original packaging.

Calpol kept by the school is for emergency use only, ie. if a child unexpectedly becomes unwell during the day. School should not be relied on to provide this.

HEAD LICE

Head lice is often a recurring problem in primary schools and we would encourage parents and carers to please check their child's head regularly. Though head lice and nits may be a nuisance, they don't cause serious illness or carry any diseases and can be treated at home with a fine tooth comb or over-the-counter medication. If head lice are found, please treat as soon as possible and inform the school office.

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What should I do if I need to take my child out of school for medical appointment?

Standard medical or dental appointments should be made outside school hours. If a child is absent for a medical appointment, it is still regarded as an absence from school.

Please make sure the school are notified of any medical appointments in advance. Parents/carers will need to fill in a **medical appointment form and also provide proof of the appointment**. If we do not see proof of the appointment, then it will be unauthorised. Any optician appointments taken during the school day will be unauthorised.

Where there is no alternative for an appointment outside of the school day, children should only miss a short period of time and return to school as promptly as possible.

What should I do if my child is absent from school?

If your child is absent from school, you must contact the school **daily**. This can be done by calling 01252 322933 and selecting option 1, or by email to adminoffice@st-michaels-jun.hants.sch.uk with the following information; child's name, year group and reason for their absence (for example high temperature or sickness bug).

If a child has been sick or has diarrhoea, they must stay off school until they have been free of symptoms for 48 hours.

All absences must be reported to the school office on each day of illness by 8.50am. If we do not receive a message regarding a child's absence, we will telephone and if necessary, text to ask for an explanation. If we are unable to contact you, we will keep trying and also contact other emergency contacts.

The absence will be marked as unauthorised until we have spoken to a parent to clarify the reason.

YEAR 3 TRIP: Butser Farm - Tuesday 3rd March

Year 3 will be visiting Butser Ancient Farm as part of this term's work on The Roman Empire. The children will be taking part in various activities including archaeological excavation, Roman maths, Flint wall building and Villa tour.

The trip will take place on Tuesday 3rd March, leaving school at 9.00am, travelling by coach and returning to school by 3.20pm. The children will need to be in school for registration by 8.40am to enable a prompt departure. The children are required to wear their school uniform and a waterproof coat, and will need a packed lunch and water bottle (in a small named bag that the child can carry). The school can provide a packed lunch at a cost of £2.75.

The cost of the trip is £24.50, and all voluntary contributions will go towards the cost of travel and the activities provided by Butser Ancient Farm. Payment is required no later than Friday 6th February and can be made via your Scopay account or cash (handed into the school office). If insufficient contributions are received, the trip may have to be cancelled.
