We believe that the curriculum should reflect our Christian school vision and our three key values of Respect, Courage and Resilience. We believe that the curriculum should allow:

- Everyone in the school community to feel valued and respected
- Everyone to have the courage and resilience to be the very best that they can be
- Everyone to develop the transferable skills which enable them to be lifelong learners

We plan topics based on our children and their needs but our current topics include 'From Cairo to Heiro', 'Routes to Justice' and 'The Road to Discovery'. In addition we teach Spanish and utilise our outside space as much as we can through a specialist Outdoor Learning teacher. Our children enjoy visits and we welcome visitors into school. These are regularly reviewed and changed but recently our Year 5s have stayed a night at

the Winchester Science Centre. RE follows the Hampshire agreed syllabus 'Living Difference'. Our Year 4 and 6 children have residential building from two nights in Year 4 to a week away in Year 6.

We encourage the children to realise their mistakes as learning opportunities and encourage them to be strong when things do not go our way.



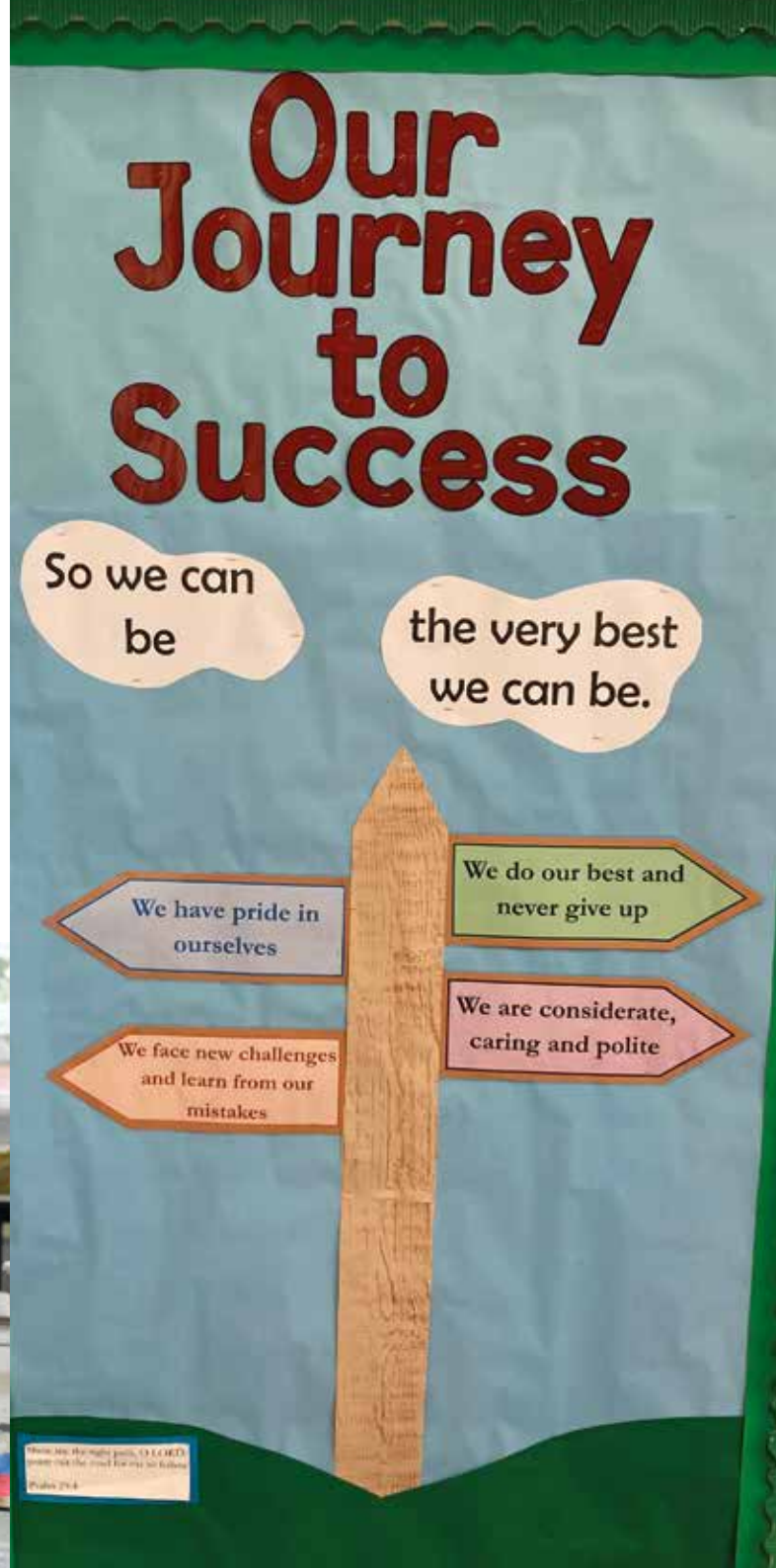

# Church Links

We are a Church of England Junior School and have strong links with St Michael's C of E Church, which is just a short walk away. We attend the local Church to celebrate events within the Christian Calendar and ensure that the highest Christian values and ethos are maintained within the school. The Vicar holds Worship once a week with us and we attend workshops for different festivals throughout the year.

# School Grounds

St. Michael's Junior school is fortunate to have extremely spacious grounds which we utilise at every opportunity. We have a large field with outdoor classroom, outdoor stage, allotment, a spiritual garden, a climbing wall and large play equipment. We also have the Jubilee Jungle where the children can explore nature further.



# Clubs

We run a variety of clubs both during lunchtimes and after school. These include, Choir, Running, Netball, Football, Mindful Colouring, Coding to name

a few. These clubs encourage the children to try new things and we find that they are very popular.

# Family Support Worker

At St. Michael's we are very lucky to have a Family Support Worker. The School Family Support Worker is here to offer support, advice, guidance and a listening ear to parents of the children at our school. Support can be offered with a wide range of issues such as: school attendance/lateness, school transition, behaviour management, confidence building and parenting concerns. Our Family Support Worker also works with children in school alongside our Emotional Literacy Support Assistants to ensure that children have the support they need to be successful in school.

# Sport

At St. Michael's Junior school we think sport and fitness is incredibly important for children. We employ a qualified coach as part of the children's PE who also provides lunchtime activities for the children.

We regularly participate in matches and tournaments and, more recently, have entered teams into our local school Netball and Football Leagues.

# Houses

We use four places in our local environment for our Houses and children can earn House Points for their learning which are collated together for the House Cup at the end of the Year. These are Blackwater, Rowhill, Manor and Brickfields.
